welcome to the second Newsletter of the **INTERFIDE-CRT** project. With this tool we keep you informed about the activities, events and progress of the initiative. In this edition we will present one of the major INTERFIDE activities: the implementation of two transnational Pilot Tours!

Thanks to the involvement of the experts and sectoral stakeholders, the InterFide-CRT project will measure and evaluate the touristic potential of the itinerary and identify possible improvements to enhance its touristic appeal and visibility, especially in low seasons. This will be the basis for scaling up and transfer pilot results to larger EU and worldwide touristic schemes such as EPA Cultural Routes and UNWTO panels on Religious and Cultural Tourism.

INTERFIDE-CRT is an acronym of Fostering Interfaith Dialogue and EnhancingCross-borderReligiousTourism.This is one of the most ambitious projects to increase the attractiveness ofnatural and cultural heritage to improve smart and sustainable economicdevelopment.

OVERVIEW

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From 21 to 27 May 2022, the InterFide project organised the FIRST PILOT TOUR which crossed Italy (stops in Bari, Canosa and Trani in Apulia; Castelpetroso, Bojano and Sepino in Molise), Albania (stops in Tirana, Lezha and Shkodra) and Montenegro (stops in Podgorica and Bijelo Polje).

The InterFide travellers visited places of worship and pilmigrage, archaeological sites, castles, museums and monuments that were selected by project partners as sites that have an intrinsic *potential* for developing interfaith tourism.

Now an emerging market niche, if well developed, interfaith tourism can play a crucial part in increasing the flow of new money in the area, in helping to create jobs and to encourage entrepreneurship, especially among younger generations, and in fostering a more sustainable tourism.

HOW DID THIS TAKE PLACE?

Travelers had the opportunity to visit:

MAY 22 APULIA: BARI AND CANOSA **The Orthodox Church of San Nicola** (Sanctuary of San Nicola) located in the historic center (Bari Vecchia, Apulia), a church that every year attracts Catholic pilgrims and Orthodox Christians;

Mausoleum of Prince Bohemund in Canosa, an important testimony of the intercultural exchange between Islamic and Christian art.





MAY 23 MOLISE: CASTELPETROSO, BOJANO AND SEPINO

Basilica of Our Lady of Sorrow (Basilica minore dell'Addolorata) in Castelpetroso, province of Isernia.

With its Gothic Revival style, it is one of the most important places of worship in Molise.

San Bartholomeo Cathedral in Bojano, province of Isernia, a very ancient church whose first restauration dates back to the XI century. **Altilia Archaeological Site** at Saepinum, province of Campobasso. Altilia was an important Roman city, dating back to 290 BC.







MAY 24 APULIA: TRANI AND CANOSA

Trani had a significant Jewish population for many years, at one point having four synagogues. Today, it hosts the oldest Jewish temple in Europe, the Scolanova Synagogue.



MAY 25 ALBANIA: SHKODER AND LEZHA

After a night in Tirana, European Youth Capital 2022, the InterFide travelers visited the beautiful **Albanian cities of Shkoder and Lezha**.





MAY 26 MONTENEGRO: PODGORICA

The Monastery of Saint Peter is the second most important religious landmark in Montenegro.

St. George's Orthodox Church, which, built between the 9th and the 11th century, is the oldest preserved building in the city. **The Resurrection of Christ Cathedral** (Saborni Hram Hristovog Vaskrsenja), one of the most visited churches by Orthodox pilgrims. **The Dajbabe Monastery**, a Serb Orthodox Christian monastery that was built on 1897 in a underground cave.





MAY 27 ALBANIA: TIRANA

The InterFide first pilot tour ended with a visit of the **Tirana Municipality**.

FROM 3 TO 9 OCTOBER 2022



OVERVIEW

The Interfide-CRT Pilot Tour # 2 tool place between 3 and 9 October 2022. The tour was organised as a follow-up of the previous edition implemented last May. This time the InterFide travelers will visit: Tirana, Podgorica, Bjelo Polje, Podvrh, Berane, Skhoder, Polignano a Mare, Alberobello, Monopoli, Canosa, Campobasso, Matrice, Montagano, Cercemaggiore and Trani. The Tour will include visits to places of worship and ecumenic meetings with religious leaders as well as moments of conviviality and sharing.

OCTOBER 4 MONTENEGRO: PODGORICA

Cathedral of the Resurrection of Christ, one of the cathedrals of the Serbian Orthodox Church. Its construction began in 1993 to a design by Predrag Ristić and its consecration took place 20 years later, on the anniversary of the Edict on Freedom of Religion.



OCTOBER 5 MONTENEGRO: BERANE

The church of St. Peter and Paul, a little gem in Bijelo Polje in Montenegro. **The Monastery of St. Nicholas** in Podvrh in Bijelo Polje is an example of Byzantine art in its final years.





OCTOBER 6 ALBANIA: TIRANA

The Ethem Bey Mosque, Tirana. The Mosque is an example of Islamic architecture, located in the famous Scanderbeg Square in Tirana. The Cathedral of the Resurrection of Christ, in Albanian 'Katedralja Ngjallja e Krishtit', is a place of worship of the Albanian Autocephalous Orthodox Church.

The **Catholic Cathedral of St Paul** belonging to the Archdiocese of Tirana-Durres.



OCTOBER 7 APULIA: CANOSA, ALBEROBELLO AND MONOPOLI

Cathedral of Purgatory and Steven Chapel and the splendid Cathedral of San Sabino.

Alberobello, a locality in Apulia that is part of the Itria Valley and the Murgia dei Trulli, declared UNESCO World Heritage in 1996. **St. Mary of Madia Church**, Monopoli.



OCTOBER 8 MOLISE: MATRICE AND MONTAGANO,

St. Mary of the Wayside Basilica in Matrice. The Basilica is located outside the village and is thought to be among the oldest and best-preserved in the region.

St. Mary in Faioli Abbey in Montagano. In the area of the Samnite center of Fagifulae, which later became a Roman municipality, a Benedictine community arose in medieval times.

St. Mary of Freedom Monastery and interreligious meeting with the "Water Route".





OCTOBER 9 TRANI

St. Mary of the Assumption, the main Catholic place of worship in the city of Trani, Apulia. The most significant examples of Apulian Romanesque architecture and was built using Trani stone, a typical building material of the area. Its construction dates back to the time of the Norman domination **Scolanova Synagogue**, Trani. A sample of Apulian Romanesque architecture. it bears witness to the city's ancient Jewish quarter.
